#### Who?

- All Leagues 9/10 and up have single elimination playoffs

#### How?

- The standard playoff format is single elimination for all SHYBA leagues. The playoff bracket is not re-seeded between rounds.
- All teams make the playoffs ensuring al teams have a chance to be the league champion.
- Standard single elimination brackets are used to the playoff scheduling
- Note: the SHYBA Bylaws stated the top team plays the lowest team, however in a standard bracket this is not always true. There may be situations where the bracket supports a different matchup.
- A Perfect bracket is a multiple of 4 leagues (4,8,16) except for 12 meaning that no team will get a bye in the first round. Most other team counts will have some number of byes in the first round. This creates the concept of "play-in" games.
- SHYBA has tried to maintain the use the term "playoffs" for all games played in this format even though some people call some initial games "play-in" games.
- Pre 2019, brackets were done in Excel by hand and schedules done in Excel as well. Since the 2019 adoption of the TeamSideline web site tools, all scheduling and bracketing is automatically done within the TeamSideline tool.

### **League Standings Note:**

- As the season unfolds and regular season games are played, the league Standing page shows all teams listed in winning percentage and tie breaker order.
- Tie Breakers are normally though about for playoff seeding but TeamSideline applied them after every game is scored. So the league standing are always accurate.

#### More How details:

- The playoffs are determined once the regular season has ended based on the regular season standings.
- SHYBA has configured TeamSideline to automatically seed the playoff schedule/bracket according to the Tie Breaker rules.
- IMPORTANT: When the last game in the regular season is scored, the playoff schedule is populated with the seedings based on the final regular season standings automatically and the bracket updated as well.
- Seeds are spoken in terms of low seed and high seed. For consistency within this document, the #1 seed corresponds to the 1<sup>st</sup> place team in the standings and is a low seed and the #8 seed corresponds to the 8<sup>th</sup> place team in the standings and is a higher seed. If you like to use the opposite terminology just remember the opposite going forward.
- Tie Breakers are continually applied to the league standings throughout the season.
- There are only 3 tie breakers used in SHYBA: Winning Percentage, Head-to-Head results, and Coin toss. The final one coin toss is done automatically within the system. Briefly each team is assigned a random number and if that tie breaker is needed these random number are compared to break the tie. The higher the number the lower the seed. For example if 2 teams

are field and feam 1 has a number of 6000 and feam 2 has a number of 7000.	ream 2 becomes
the higher position in the standings but a lower seed.	

#### When?

- Normally the playoff season starts as close to March 1 and runs for 2 weeks culminating in a Championship Saturday at SAHS where all league championship games are played back to backto-back with a DJ spinning tunes, National anthem played for each game and teams announced, and trophies handed out after each game.
- The initial date for Championship Saturday is determined in August/September.
- An attempt is made to not conflict with Spring sports starting up in March timeframe.
- Enough time is built into the playoff schedules to accommodate weather cancellations
- Approximately 8 weeks prior to the start of the playoffs, playoff planning begins (roughly January 1). Gym time is reviewed and if additional time is needed, requests are submitted to the gym vendors as needed.
- A preliminary complete plan is determined back planning from the Championship Saturday date and including Travel program needs as well. The preliminary plan includes the start and end dates and any anomalies that are known. This preliminary plan is reviewed at the January board meeting and approval given to do the detailed level of planning to meet the goal of Championship Saturday.
- Once the preliminary plan is agreed-to, the scheduler works on filling in the various needs of each league. The general bracket rounds needed, and gym allocations are created.
- As soon as possible a playoff schedule is created in TeamSideline with TBD dates showing the rounds needed. This allows the discussions to proceed.
- Discussions begins with the commissioners and ultimately a playoff schedule is approved at a minimum 2 weeks before the playoffs begin.
- Once approved, the playoff schedule is delivered to the Referee Coordinator for referee scheduling.
